The School of Government Archives were placed on permanent loan at the Grosse Pointe Historical Society Resource Center in October 2001. Once the collection had been organized and a finding aid completed, the collection was opened for public use without restriction in March 2003.

Concerned since its inception with the discussion of topical, government-related issues, the School of Government was founded as the School of Government of Wayne County in 1940 by Clara Hantel Brucker (1897-1980). She was the wife of Wilbur M. Brucker, a Grosse Pointe Farms resident, former Michigan Governor and Secretary of the Army under President Dwight D. Eisenhower. Though at first there was limited, local interest in forming a political study group, Mrs. Brucker was able to attract sufficient women to create an independent, non-partisan club for the purpose of studying legislation and government at all levels. Mrs. Brucker served as the group's first president and continued throughout her life as its Educational Director. The club's first event, a mock presidential convention scripted by Wilbur Brucker, attracted 1,000 women to the Book Cadillac Hotel.

From its inception, the Club drew its membership, which today numbers over 200, from all parts of metropolitan Detroit. It has always been run as traditional organization with a President, Officers and Standing Committees. The latter include Membership, Press Relations, Legislative. Social Affairs, Telephone, Projects (usually fundraisers), Yearbook (membership directory) and Reception (event hospitality). Since 1941, the Club has been a member of the Detroit Federation of Women's Clubs.

Over the years, membership meetings, on the second Wednesday of each month from September to April, have been held in a variety of locations. The Downtown YWCA was the club's meeting place until 1958, when members transferred to the Detroit Historical Museum. From 1962 to 1964, meetings were held in the Veteran's Memorial Building on Jefferson Avenue in Downtown Detroit but in the latter year were moved to the Women's City Club. From 1976 to 1980, the Detroit Athletic Club, with some visits to the Detroit Boat Club, was a favorite gathering place. In more recent times, members have assembled in a variety of metropolitan area private clubs or in private homes.

Topics for General Membership Meetings have usually related to issues of the day. Speakers have frequently had a national reputation. Both the Hon. Wilbur Brucker and Mrs. Brucker spoke several times over the years. General Maxwell Taylor was a lecturer in 1956 followed soon after by

Mme Chiang Kai Shek . Sen. Margaret Chase Smith spoke in 1977. Other presenters have included scholars, judges, politicians and community leaders. As a beginning for its 50th Anniversary celebration, the Club arranged for a special day at Selfridge National Guard Base near Mt. Clemens, MI. In additional to regular meetings, the Club has also held occasional special events such the 1965 Lecture Series on Foreign Policy co-sponsored with the Grosse Pointe War Memorial.

The School of Government Archives is made up primarily of meeting, membership and photographic materials as well as some minutes. There are announcements, programs, some resumes, newspaper clippings, correspondence, brochures, photographs and some memorabilia. Scrapbooks developed over the years have been photocopied and pertinent items removed to appropriate files. Where feasible, photographs have been removed from scrapbooks, placed in polyester sleeves and filed in chronological order as a separate series. Scrapbooks containing clippings from 1940 to 1980 have been retained. The scrapbook for the 1980s has been retained in its entirety.
